About NESMS

A centre of musical excellence for 40 years.

NESMS is a renowned centre of music tuition. Located in Aberdeen City Centre, it serves the whole of the North East of Scotland, including the Highlands and Islands. NESMS was founded in 1975 by Dorothy Hatley with the support and encouragement of Lady Aberdeen. From small beginnings in its original premises in Belmont Street, NESMS has grown and now has 19 tutors teaching over 250 students. Dorothy died in 1996 just prior to the opening of our Huntly Street premises.

TUITION

NESMS is open to musically talented individuals of all ages. We endeavour to provide tuition for anyone who has reached a suitable level of attainment - whatever their circumstances or musical background.

NESMS brings internationally recognized tutors to Aberdeen on a regular basis so that our students do not have to travel in order to gain the highest calibre of musical education. NESMS offers

- One-to-one tuition
- Workshops
- Masterclasses
- Performance opportunities

FEES & SCHOLARSHIPS

Students pay their own fees. These fees are subsidised by the funding streams outlined below (Finance). There is a generous programme of scholarships for which any student in full time education can apply. Students do not have to be previously enrolled at NESMS to be eligible. Auditions are held in November for funding in the following calendar year. In the past, we have also been able to make assistance available to students in financial hardship thanks to generous donations from the John Gordon Foundation.


There will be a lunchtime celebration on **Sunday 21st June at 12.30pm** at NESMS to

Mary Wetherick bids us goodbye after 40 years at NESMS

Mary Wetherick was a friend of Dorothy Hatley and has been involved in NESMS since its very earliest days. Mary is both a cellist and pianist and was at one time a member of the University of Aberdeen Orchestra. She has accompanied for both Raimund Herinx and Alan Watt. During her many years at the school, she has been respected as a pianist who could play anything! She would never know from one lesson to the next what was going to be put in front of her and she relished every new musical challenge. When she and her husband Norman retired to Edinburgh she continued to travel monthly to Aberdeen to accompany Raimund and Alan. In 2003 Mary was awarded an Honorary Fellowship in recognition of her long-standing service to NESMS. Alan comments, "Mary and I have worked together at the North East of Scotland Music School for many years. She has always been very encouraging, enthusiastic and supportive of the students. As well as being a very accomplished accompanist, she has greatly contributed to the lessons in the way of interpretation of the pieces and shown a real knowledge of the various languages sung. Alison Waller



In 1994 Alison Waller travelled from Edinburgh to Aberdeen to teach at a summer school run as part of the Aberdeen International Youth Festival. It was here that she met Dorothy Hatley. As anyone who had the pleasure of knowing Dorothy will tell you, she wasn't one to let a wonderful musician slip through her hands. She wrote to Alison on 14th January 1995 and Alison was teaching at NESMS eleven days later! The rest, as they say, is history - 20 years of wonderful teaching history at NESMS.

Alison was born and brought up in Hertfordshire. She studied at the Royal College of Music in London and then spent several years free-lancing in the London area. In 1979 she moved to live in Edinburgh. She was already familiar with the orchestral scene in Scotland having previously played for the Scottish Chamber Orchestra and the orchestra of Scottish Ballet. While in Edinburgh, Alison played with the Royal Scottish National Orchestra, the BBC Symphony Orchestra, Scottish Opera, and the SCO. Alison taught for 35 years at Edinburgh Napier and has

been teaching for the last 25 years at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland.

Alison examines for the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music and has tutored the clarinet sections for the National Youth Orchestras of Scotland. In 2013, Alison moved to Herefordshire and has shown an enormous level of dedication to her students at NESMS in putting in place complex travel arrangements to ensure that she could see them each month and provide them with the continuity of lessons that has meant so much to them in their musical development.

Several of her NESMS students have pursued musical careers and keep Alison up to date with their activities. Some maintain their Aberdeen links: Ian Wilson returns as recorder teacher at NESMS and Yla Garvie teaches Aberdeen University students. Gemma Carlin, having studied at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, is now their Music Ensembles Manager within the Artistic Planning Department. Tom Lessels enjoys a flourishing career in London as a member of both the Academy of St Martins in the Fields and Aurora orchestras.

Alison's pupils, past and present, would like to extend a huge thank you to her for her many years of outstanding clarinet tuition at NESMS. We are delighted to announce that Tom Lessels and Ian Wilson have been appointed as NESMS' new clarinet instructors. Alison's students will shortly be receiving more information about their new tutors.

Lizzie Davis

Lizzie Davis took up the horn at age 13 and by the age of 16 she had passed Associated Board grade eight. "I was given the option by my parents of either practising or washing up and playing the horn won every time!" Lizzie recalls. Lizzie grew up in Cardiff and attended the Cardiff College of Music and Drama where she studied with William Davis. Subsequently, she won the Corporation of London Brass Scholarship to the Guildhall School of Music and Drama to study with Francis Bradley where she was awarded the John Clifford Pettican Prize. At the same time she studied privately with Ifor James.

Lizzie moved to Manchester in 1976 as Principal Horn of the Manchester Camerata and has also played with the Lancashire Sinfonietta.

As well as teaching privately, she is horn and chamber music tutor at Chetham's School of Music. Her pupils have gained scholarships to all the major music colleges.



Lizzie became an examiner to the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music in 1990 and was appointed to their panel of trainers in 2001. In 2004 Lizzie was appointed horn tutor at the Royal Northern College of Music. She has coached the horn section of the Lancashire Students Symphony Orchestra and the horns of the National Children's Orchestra of Great Britain. She has published numerous Horn music books.

Her association with the North East of Scotland Music School began in 2004 when she was asked by Ifor James to take over from him as he was retiring through ill health.

Lizzie says "My students have all shown me great loyalty, many of them travelling hours to get to Aberdeen. I shall miss their company greatly and hope that they all continue to make fine progress under their new tutor.

I should also like to mention the contribution of my hosts who have offered me lifts to and from the airport, fed me and become great friends, in particular Jenny and Murdoch Shirreffs whose support of NESMS tutors has become the stuff of legend!"

Lizzie has been a tremendously dedicated and loyal NESMS tutor over the years. She has often had to battle north through dreadful weather conditions to ensure that her students got their monthly lessons. We are so sorry that Lizzie will be retiring from NESMS at the end of June of this year. Her inspirational teaching will be greatly missed by all her students as will the camaraderie that they shared with her and each other during the monthly get-togethers of the horn ensemble.
